Welcome to Our Services Today

This morning we are back in the Sermon on the Mount and our theme is 'Radical Love over Hate'. Like last Sunday morning we come face to face with some of the most challenging teaching of the whole of the ministry of Jesus.

It was to be love that was to characterise the life of the follower of Jesus and the life of the Christian community.

Not only was there to be love shared sacrificially amongst that community but that love was to be expressed even to enemies. As Jesus puts it 'If you greet only your brothers, what are you doing more than others?'

We are living at a time and in a culture where there are worrying signs of an increasing inability to listen to those with whom we disagree - and to vilify those with whom we disagree. We hear much in the media of hate speech - and of the trashing of people online. Those who follow Jesus must resist at all costs the temptation to follow suit. Easter is a time when we remember the one who died for his enemies - that is you and me! Paul writing to the Romans says 'For if, when we were God's enemies, we were reconciled to him through the death of his Son, how much more having been reconciled, shall we be saved through his life!'

This evening, we continue with our series on Mountains in the Bible - we are looking at Mount Tabor - and the *Transfiguration of Jesus* from Matthew 17.
