Welcome to Our Services Today

This morning, we begin a series on 1 Corinthians a letter to a Church in Greece which St Paul established and a church he had at times a somewhat fraught relationship with! It's a letter which has the famous *chapter 13 i*n it "If I speak in the tongues of men and of angels but don't have love" and chapter 15 - the great chapter on the resurrection of Christ. But the rest of this powerful and challenging letter is not really well known at all. So, over the coming months, with some breaks, we will be exploring and studying all of it. The Church at Corinth was gifted and far from perfect - made up of men and women like you and me seeking to follow Jesus Christ in a society which either didn't understand what on the earth the Christian faith was - or sought to ridicule it. Paul clearly loves them but does not hold back in speaking the truth to them.

The challenge for us - the Church here in Ditton? Will we humbly and lovingly submit ourselves to Apostolic teaching, even when it challenges our most deeply held beliefs? Even if it puts us at odds with many of the people we know? How we do this with love and humility will be the supreme challenge for the Church not just in Ditton but in the UK in these coming years.

This evening, we continue our series on "Practicing the Christian Life". This evening our theme from Galatians 5 is '*Led By the Spirit'*.
