Welcome to Our Services Today

This morning, we continue to explore 1 Corinthians a letter written by St Paul to a church he had founded in Greece in the bustling cosmopolitan seaport of Corinth. It was a Church full of life and gifts but in so many ways very dysfunctional - and facing huge challenges from the surrounding culture. Like the Churches of the West today! In these closing verses of the second chapter Paul continues his teaching on where true Christian wisdom is to be found. For Paul wisdom is not to be found in lofty speech and high-sounding rhetoric - which had so captivated the Corinthians - but was to be found in the message of the crucified Christ. It is a message as Paul explains which is foolishness to many as he himself puts it:

"None of the rulers of this age it, for if they had they would not have understood crucified the Lord of Glory".

This evening we conclude our series on "Practicing the Christian Life" - our theme is "Hospitality".

Next Sunday morning we are welcoming Jane Moxon as our visiting preacher from **CMJ** (**Church's Ministry Amongst Jewish People**).

In the evening, we begin a short series of sermons from the book of the Prophet Jeremiah.
