A debate is scheduled on Friday November 29th on the question of allowing assisted dying to be made legal in the UK.

There are many (the Rector of Ditton included) who believe that any attempts to change the present law to allow this practice to take place would be a dangerous thing for our country to allow. Ross presented a paper on this issue to a Church meeting earlier in the year outlining some of the major concerns around a change in the law. If you also feel the same way now is the time to write to your MP and ask them to oppose any changes in

legislation.
