How do we live as Christians in a way that doesn't offend or cause distress to our fellow believers? Do we even think about such issues at all? Paul is again addressing questions of how Christians are to live in a pagan culture something which he focuses on particularly in chapters 8 through to 10.

This evening, we continue our series in the last book of the Old Testament the book of Malachi. Our theme is "Don't despise Me" from the last part of chapter 1.
