Nowhere else in the New Testament is this great hope so clearly laid out - and it is all based on the resurrection of Jesus Christ - his bodily

resurrection (on the 3rd day 1 Cor 15 v 4). Because he has been raised - those who trust in him will also be raised!

Yet this wonderful truth about the future is not just for the future. It has to shape the way in which the follower of Jesus understands their life here - from one week to the next. Just notice how Paul ends this chapter - read verse 58! All that we do now in the Lords service whatever it might be - the whole of our living for him is not in vain and will be remembered.
