New Preaching series for 2026

We will be starting a new series on **Sunday mornings** from the *First letter of John or 1 John.* We live in an age that is hungry for spiritual experience, sometimes at the cost of truth. The New Testament has much to say about both truth and experience. How do we get the balance right?

For Christians in the first century this question was a very profound reality - and it is in large part why the Apostle John wrote this wonderful letter. His argument as it unfolds shows that it is truth which must interpret our experience and the other way round. The word of God - the Bible, never conflicts with the Spirit of God.

In a culture where truth is at a premium where we often hear people say 'What is true for you is not true for me ' or speak of ' my truth ' how can this letter help us?

For our Evening series we will be exploring the enigmatic book of **Ecclesiastes**. We've called the series "Everything is Never Enough" because that was the experience of the writer! He did it all! He had money, education, possessions, sex and power everything our world presents muses will bring joy - yet he was never satisfied. And from his discontent ,we benefit and find a surprisingly simple trail to lasting joy. Why not join us on Sunday evenings for what promises to be a fascinating journey!
